RULES - CLASSIFICATION

Current NRA Metallic Silhouette Rifle Rules will apply. Unclassified competitors will compete in the highest available class. Classification books must be presented when registering at the Range.

COMPETITION - ELIGIBILITY

Canadian residents must have a current SRAC membership. Non-residents must be members of their respective national bodies. I.e.: U.S. residents must have either an SRAC membership OR proof of NRA membership. Competitors must present copies of their membership cards when submitting entry. **SRAC memberships will be available at the range.**

SPECIAL SQUADDING REQUESTS

Requests for special squadding of competitors sharing equipment or coaching will be accommodated in-so-far as possible on a first come, first serve basis, provided such requests are made IN WRITING, and entries for ALL competitors involved are included with the request. Unfortunately, it will not be possible to consider special squadding requests for late entries.

CERTIFICATION OF FIREARMS

All rifles must be certified prior to their use in the tournament.

Rifle certification Small-bore: July 28, 29, 1 p.m. - 7 p.m., High Power: August 2, 1 p.m. - 7 p.m. Please do not certify High Power rifles before the Small-bore matches unless there is no lineup. Equipment & apparel may be inspected at random by Match Officials during the matches.


TIE BREAKING

Following the completion of each days matches, ties will be broken using a single shot knockout format with the exception of National Champion which will be broken using a five shot string, fired on Turkeys.

PROTESTS

There will be a \$40 fee for any protest brought to the jury. If the jury deems the protest to be valid \$40 will be refunded to the protester otherwise it will go into the target setters donations fund.

 Clarification of rule 3.1.1 High Power Hunting Silhouette Rifle and rule 3.2.1 Smallbore Hunting Silhouette Rifle.

As Robertson Composite, HS Precision, Manners and additional stocks of this configuration have been used in the past, at the 2017 National Championships any Hunting Rifle stock that fits into the stock dimension jig of rule 3.1d, will be allowed to be used in the competition. When the rifle passes certification, no protest to the jury will be allowed as to the angle of the pistol grip, diameter of the pistol grip, width of the cheek piece, angle of the recoil pad, etc. . If the competitor is unable to realize their goals by performance, they will not be allowed to realize their goals by protest. 

SMALL-BORE MATCH SCHEDULE

Competitors will score for the shooter immediately following them on the line. The last relay will score for the first relay. Presentation of awards will follow the completion of both matches.

July 28, 29	Range open for practice – <u>SMALL-BORE ONLY</u> ~ Competitors are to set their own targets and police the range. Clubhouse will be open for picking up of registration kits. <i>Watch bulletin boards for official notices.</i>
July 30	8:30am - Opening ceremonies 9:00am - One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match. Shoot-offs after each match
July 31	9:00am - One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match
August 1	9:00am - One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match.

HIGH POWER MATCH SCHEDULE

August 2	Range open for practice. Competitors will be responsible to set their own targets and policing of the range
August 3	9:00am - One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match
August 4	9:00am - One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match
August 5	9:00am - One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match

SMALL-BORE AND HIGH POWER AWARDS SCHEDULE

Presentation of match awards will follow the completion of the day's matches. Aggregate awards will be presented following the presentation of the match awards on the final day of each competition
Under three shooters per class, shooters will be moved up to the next higher class, or compete for Match Winner Award (rule 19.8)

PIN AWARDS

Small-bore: 10 in-a-row pins will be awarded to all classes, 5 in-a-row pins only to "B", "A", "AA"

High Power: 5 and 10 in-a-pins will be awarded to all classes

SAFETY

All rules for safety will be strictly enforced. Failure to conform will be a basis for disqualification

1. Rifle actions will be open at all times except on the firing line after the command "READY" is given. At the command "CEASE FIRE" all firearm actions will be opened IMMEDIATELY, Open bolt indicators are MANDATORY.
2. "Dry firing" or aiming firearms behind the firing line is prohibited. Firing line commands must be observed by the users of the designated dry firing area.
3. When not on the firing line firearms will be placed on racks, in cases or other safe places.
4. A shot fired before the "READY" will result in disqualification for the day's match.
5. The Match Director or Range Officer has the authority to ban any competitor, firearm or ammunition at any time for safety reasons.

6. Consumption of any alcoholic beverage, narcotic or controlled substance which can impair the normal mental or physical functions of the body, either on the range or in the spectator or public areas immediately adjacent to the range while the range is in use is prohibited. Disorderly conduct or intoxication is not permitted on the range or any contiguous range property. Violators of this regulation will be subject to immediate disqualification from these Championships with no return of entry fees.

There will be a competitors meeting held on July 30th, 2017 at the Range. The meeting time will be posted at the range.
