SMALLBORE: June 28, 29, 30. HIGH POWER: July 2, 3, 4.

The 2026 CANADIAN RIFLE SILHOUETTE CHAMPIONSHIPS will be held at the Rosebud Silhouette & Benchrest Club near Calgary, AB. There is space on the range site for tenting, and R.V.s (no plugins). Fresh spring water is available close by. There will be lunch available each match day.

Rosebud Silhouette and Benchrest Club is located within Kananaskis Country, which is under a provincial park pass system. Traveling through the park to the range and parking at the range are not under the park pass requirements. Any sightseeing or stopping within the provincial park will require a pass available from <https://www.alberta.ca/kananaskis-conservation-pass-or-you-will-be-fined>.

RULES -CLASSIFICATION

Current NRA Metallic Silhouette Rifle Rules will apply. Unclassified competitors will compete in the highest available class. Classification books must be presented when registering at the range.

COMPETITION - ELIGIBILITY

Canadian residents must have a current SRAC membership. Non-residents must be members of their respective national bodies, i.e.: U.S. residents must have either an SRAC membership OR proof of NRA membership. Competitors must furnish copies of their membership cards when submitting entry. SRAC memberships will be available at the range. Note: All targets will be painted white.

SPECIAL SQUADDING REQUESTS.

Requests for special squadding of competitors sharing equipment or coaching will be accommodated in-so-far as possible on a first come, first serve basis, provided such requests are made IN WRITING, and entries for ALL competitors involved are included with the request. Unfortunately, it will not be possible to consider special squadding requests for late entries.

CERTIFICATION OF FIREARMS.

All rifles must be certified prior to their use in the tournament.

Rifle certification Smallbore: June 26, 27, 1 p.m. - 7 p.m., High Power: July 1, 1 p.m. - 7 p.m. Please do not certify High Power rifles before the Smallbore matches unless there is no lineup. Equipment & apparel may be inspected at random by Match Officials during the matches.

TIE BREAKING

Following the completion of each day's matches, ties will be broken using a single shot knockout format except for National Champion which will be broken using a five-shot string, fired on Turkeys.

SMALLBORE MATCH SCHEDULE

Competitors will score for the shooter immediately following them on the line. The last relay will score for the first relay. Presentation of awards will follow the completion of both matches.

June 26, 27 Range opens for practice – **SMALLBORE ONLY** as posted on the bulletin board. Competitors to set their own targets and police the range.

Clubhouse will be in open for registration and picking up of scoring kits. Watch bulletin boards for official notices.

June 28, **7:30am**, Opening ceremonies.

8:00am, One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match. Shoot-offs after each match.

June 29, **8:00am**, One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match.

June 30, **8:00am**, One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match.

HIGH POWER MATCH SCHEDULE

July 1, Range opens for practice. Competitors will be responsible to set their own targets and policing of the range. Clubhouse will be in open for registration and picking up of scoring kits for HP ONLY competitors

July 2, **9:00am**, One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match.

July 3, **9:00am**, One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match.

July 4, **9:00am**, One 40 shot Standard Rifle match followed by one 40 shot Hunting Rifle match.

SMALLBORE AND HIGH POWER AWARDS SCHEDULE

Presentation of match awards will follow the completion of the day's matches. Aggregate awards will be presented following the presentation of the match awards on the final day of each competition.

Under three shooters per class, shooters will be moved up to the next higher class, or compete for Match Winner Award (rule 19.8).

HIGH ANIMAL AWARDS.

For Smallbore and High Power, Silhouette and Hunting Rifle Classes.
Pig - "B" Class, Chicken - "A" Class, Ram - "AA" Class, Turkey - "AAA" & Master Class

PIN AWARDS

Smallbore: 10 in-a-row pins will be awarded to all classes, 5 in-a-row pins only to "B", "A", and "AA" Classes

High Power: 5 and 10 in-a-row pins will be awarded to all classes.

SAFETY

All rules for safety will be strictly enforced. Failure to conform will be a basis for disqualification.

1. Rifle actions will be always open with the empty chamber indicator inserted except on the firing line after the command "READY" is given. At the command "CEASE FIRE" all firearm actions will be opened IMMEDIATELY; Open bolt indicators are MANDATORY.

2. "Dry firing" or aiming firearms behind the firing line is prohibited. Firing line commands must be observed by the users of the

designated dry firing area.

3. When not on the firing line firearms will be placed on racks, in cases or other safe places.

4. A shot fired before the "READY" will result in disqualification for the day's match.

5. The Match Director or Range Officer has the authority to ban any competitor, firearm, or ammunition at any time for reasons of safety.

6. Consumption of any alcoholic beverage, narcotic or controlled substance which can impair the normal mental or physical functions of the body, either on the range or in the spectator or public areas immediately adjacent to the range while the range is in use is prohibited. Disorderly conduct or intoxication is not permitted on the range or any contiguous range property. Violators of this regulation will be subject to immediate disqualification from these Championships with no return of entry fees.

SRAC SILHOUETTE MEETING

There will be a competitors meeting held on June 28, 2026, at the Range. The meeting time will be shortly after the award presentations.
